Be Informed

Know what to do before, during, and after an emergency. Potential threats in South Florida include:

- Extreme Weather
- Floods
- Hazardous Materials
- Hurricanes
- Pandemics
- Radiological Events
- Terrorism
- Utility Failures

Communication and Alerts

Centure on Institute will notify students and employees of closures or cancellations via:

- Email
- Text message
- Website updates at https://centureon.institute

If Centureon Institute does not issue a separate notice, it will follow the <u>Miami-Dade</u> <u>County Public Schools</u> emergency closures.

Emergency Preparedness Actions

- Develop a personal/family emergency plan using tools such as Ready South Florida or Ready.gov.
- Prepare an emergency supply kit (3–5 days of essentials).
- Follow local government instructions at all times.
- Protect valuables and unplug electronics.

- Backup digital data and safeguard documents.
- Keep your vehicle fueled and know evacuation routes.
- Know what to bring to a shelter (bedding, medicine, snacks, etc.).
- Comply with official evacuation orders when issued.

During and After the Emergency

- Follow official local instructions.
- Use any available means (text, call, social media) to inform loved ones of your safety.
- Wait for the official 'all-clear' notification before returning to campus.
- Do not assume classes resume until officially notified by Centureon Institute.

Terrorism Awareness
